Joplin Senior Center in need of volunteer drivers

A program that ordinarily struggles to find volunteers is now in a dire need of them. The Joplin Senior Center is desperate for volunteers to deliver hot meals to homebound recipients. Allison Riddle, community services director for Region 10 of the Area Agency on Aging, said the center has seen several of its volunteers move away lately. "We could not do that program without volunteers, period," Riddle said. "It basically comes down to a waiting list. Fewer meals will go out when there isn't enough people to take them out." The senior center is one of the beneficiaries of the agency's nutrition program, which provides about 22,500 meals a month to recipients in Jasper, Newton, McDonald and Barton counties. Stephanie Denham, nutrition program director for the agency, said that there are about 11 routes to cover about 200 daily participants in the program. Each route takes a two-person team of a driver and runner - the driver transports all the meals while the runner goes up to each home's door, delivers the meal and does a quick well-being check.

Denham said the Joplin Senior Center has an immediate need for about six volunteers, and even more to open up a waiting list for the program.

"We already have a waiting list because the routes are so big," Denham said. "We're hoping to lift that waiting list in July, but that won't happen without volunteers." Funding is a challenge for the program. In April a fundraiser brought in a record \$19,000 in donations. State and federal budget allocations don't cover the amount of money the program needs, requiring the extra fundraising, and Riddle said those allocations have been stagnant since 2009. But the meal doesn't matter if no one is available to deliver it, Riddle said. Volunteers work for about 90 minutes to pack and deliver the meals, which cannot be held for too long because of food safety reasons.

"They help pack up the meals and organize them, get out to their routes and get back in time to eat for themselves," Riddle said. "It's a short period of time, but it makes a huge difference. People wouldn't get those meals without the volunteers."

Members Present: Pat Tikkanen (President), Patty Heagel (President-Elect), Bill Eichman (Treasurer), Linda Rappa (Christian Ed), and Coleen Cameron (Secretary).

Call to Order: President, Pat Tikkanen called the meeting to order.

Opening Devotions: Patty Heagel led the group in

prayer.

Consensus Acceptance of Agenda, Council Minutes and Reports: Minutes from April 17, 2019 were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's Report: 50% of the insurance payment was paid in April. Giving was below in April by \$1,927.00. The NAMI check/donation has not been received yet. Money has been reimbursed for the meal. WGS asked to decide where the monies should go. It was determined that the monies would go to facility use fees/donations. Reviewed the Reserve Account Balances. Discussed whether the Communion Tray/Cup fund could be dissolved by placing in the general fund or returning the donated amount. Coleen will follow up. Due to the fact that most congregation members don't have a working knowledge of the Constitution, it was suggested that a guideline sheet for committee chairs on constitution guidelines be developed. Bill announced that he is requesting committee budget requests for next (2020) year. He also mentioned he will be gone until June 6th and will try to have everything paid up prior to leaving. The Finance Committee did not meet prior to Council meeting. Treasurer's report MSP for approval.

Reviewed Facilities report, Christian Education and verbal report from Welcome Grow Serve. MSP all reviewed reports.

Old Business

MSP (Ministry Site Profile): Patty stated she received 3 more surveys from the congregation for a total of 25 surveys. A copy of the final document will be sent to council members prior to being sent to the Synod after the convention. She will add what we are looking for in a leader.

Synod Assembly: The candidates for the Bishop election are posted and Pat asked that their profiles be reviewed. There is no information yet about any resolutions to come before the convention. Pat shared that a congregational offering will be collected to send to the convention with our delegates. Envelopes will be made available to this special offering over the next couple of weeks.

New Business

Pat shared that she was shared a form from the past, "When God Calls Me Home to Heaven". It is for use in planning a funeral. Pat will share with Pastor Gates for his review.

Edna Lassman has a white round folding table to use for card playing and wants to "loan" it to the church. Group in agreement. Pat will give the information to Amber for filing. Identification is on the table.

A cross has been given in memory of Georgene Bessey and it has been requested to hang it in the Sunday School room. Pat asked Linda as chair of Christian Education to follow up on this.

Nominating Committee for 2020: Pat asked all to help ask congregation members to help serve on this committee.

Next Meeting will fall on Father's Day and it was decided to meet on June 9, 2019 at 10:30 instead.


Meeting adjourned with no further business with reciting of the Lord's Prayer.
